

## NCOP QUESTION 411

**Mrs E C van Lingen (DA-EC) to ask the Minister of Energy:**

- 1) What was the total Integrated National Electrification Programme (INEP) expenditure for each province, in respect of the 2010 FIFA World Cup Soccer Tournament projects for the (a) 2009-10 and (b) 2010-11 financial years;
- 2) Whether these INEP projects were funded through the World Cup Fund; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details;
- 3) (a) how many local residents benefitted from these projects and (b) which entities currently maintain the projects? CW510E

## REPLY

- 1) The total Integrated National Electrification Programme (INEP) expenditure for each province, in respect of the 2010 FIFA World Cup Soccer Tournament projects for the (a) 2009-10 and (b) 2010-11 financial years is as follows:

- 2) No, the Department provides funding for household electrification and the related bulk infrastructure; therefore, the 2010 World Cup related bulk infrastructure was also funded on this basis, which amounted to R 2,8 billion. The Department managed to assist in the implementation of these projects by

allocating an estimated R 336 million, Municipalities as well as National Treasury had to provide counter funding in order to complete all the projects.

- 3) a) Since electricity networks are interconnected, the infrastructure that was created was not only meant for World Cup stadia, but also to support existing residential settlements in terms of improving quality of supply. An estimated 1500 new developments benefited from these projects.
- b) The entire infrastructure that was created is currently maintained by the respective Municipalities.
