What do we know about the Omicron variant so far?

- The World Health Organization has declared Omicron to be a “variant of concern”
- Omicron has far more mutations than any previous variant
- The variant is readily detected by the current COVID-19 PCR tests
- Vaccines are highly effective against severe illness, hospitalisation and death

We still need to understand:

- Whether the variant is transmitted more easily between people
- Whether the variant increases the risk of reinfection
- Whether the variant causes more severe disease

- Any person who does not wear a mask in a public place will be committing an offence

How can you protect yourself against
